This commitment supports Icomera's target, set at the start of 2019, of contributing to a 3.5 million metric ton reduction in global carbon emissions by 2022.

Icomera's environmental goals complement its parent company ENGIE's vision for a world zero-carbon transition that prevents the threats which climate change poses. ENGIE uses its position as a multinational green energy and mobility player to deliver the zero-carbon transition "as a service" for its clients throughout the world.

Trees for Life CEO Steve Micklewright said, "We are delighted to be partnering with Icomera as they seek to mitigate the impact of their operations while working to promote sustainable transport. Icomera's generous contribution will stand as a lasting legacy in Scotland's wild forest – providing a woodland habitat where wildlife can roam, and communities can thrive."

Henning Ankarudd, Icomera's Senior Vice President and Head of Sustainability said, "Icomera embraces carbon offsetting as one of several concurrent methods to improve the sustainability of our operations in the most responsible ways possible. Other strategies that Icomera employs to reduce global CO₂ emissions include the effective use of video conferencing tools and strengthening regional offices around the world to be closer to clients, reducing the need for air travel."
